NIA FILES CHARGE-SHEET AGAINST 17 IN HIJB-UT-TAHRIR (HuT) CASE

National Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a comprehensive Chargesheet against seventeen individuals in connection with the Hijb-ut-Tahrir (HuT) case.

The case was initially registered as FIR No: 05/2023 dated 09.05.2023 by STF/ATS Bhopal under sections 120B, 153B & 121A of Indian Penal Code-1860, and sections 13(1)(b), 17,18 & 18B of UA(P) Act-1967.

NIA investigations revealed that the members of Hizb-ut-Tahrir (HuT) were clandestinely recruiting and building their cadres in Madhya Pradesh. It has also been established that the accused were inspired by the HuT's radical ideology, which aimed at creating a Shariat-based Islamic nation in India through the means of violent acts. As an organisation, they kept their activities secret to avoid being caught, added

like-minded people in their group and organised Training Camps clandestinely. Their preparations included training in arms-shooting and commando tactics to their group members. Their plans and tactics extended to attacks on Police personnel and targeting individuals of different communities. This dangerous intent was aimed to threaten the unity, integrity, security, and sovereignty of India, with the explicit goal of striking terror among the people.

Further investigations in the case remain in progress.
